Our inscribed pots are a wonderful way to mark a special occasion like a wedding, anniversary or retirement. The charge for a standard inscription (up to 10 words) is £79.50, plus the price of the pot - pots must be a minimum 11" high (28cm). We will always try and make your pot as quickly as possible but please leave 7-9 weeks for us to make, dry and fire your pot. We can do more complex inscriptions - please contact us for a quote.
